We have learnt our new sound 's' and all about the number 3. We have talked about our feelings and read books which help us to understand these feelings. We have been on scavenger hunts, singing nursery rhymes, visiting our different outdoor areas and we've also had lots of messy play inbetween our learning this week too!



Next week

Our literacy learning will centre around the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We have lots of exciting activities planned for this! Our maths learning will link to the beanstalk with a focus on short and tall, as well as recapping numbers I, 2 and 3 and representing these. Our new sound in phonics will be 'd', whilst reviewing our sounds 'm', 'a' and 's'.
