Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Thomas Bullock

We have had a lovely first week back at school, it was exciting to welcome the children back after a six week break, they have all settled back into the routine extremely well including several new children who have joined in different year groups. It was particularly pleasing to greet the Nursery children and a full Reception Class who have all made a fantastic start to their education journey this week.

We will all have been saddened by the announcement of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. As a school community our thoughts and prayers are with her family at this difficult time. We held an assembly to celebrate her life this morning sharing our gratefulness for her servitude over the last seventy years. We will continue to answer any questions children may have and continue to offer support throughout the mourning period. We would like to remind you that school will remain open throughout. The day of the Queen's funeral will be a public holiday and therefore schools will be closed if this falls on a weekday. Next week Revd Laura will be leading a remembrance service for our school, once we know the date and venue for this we will let you know.

It is our school's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary this term and we will be looking to celebrate on October 21<sup>st</sup>. Further details will be shared nearer the time.

## REMINDERS

### Holidays

We will be sending out a letter regarding requesting pupil leave of absence during term time next week and the implications this will have. However, please be reminded that, the law gives **no entitlement to parents to take their children on holiday during the 38 weeks of term time.** As Headteacher I do not have the authority in law to authorise absences for holidays or related activities unless there are 'exceptional' circumstances. More information will follow in the letter. Please be made aware that Norfolk County Council track children's attendance and may issue a Fixed Penalty Notice and/or proceed to a Fast Track.

#### Uniform and general appearance

Thank you for following our school uniform, the children looked smart and prepared on their return. Please ensure hair slides and bands are plain with no embellishments or bright colours and follow the school colours of navy and white.

#### **Driving and Parking**

For the safety of the children please do not park or drive through the entrance roundabout, or on the yellow lines outside school where there is bus parking. We do not have school parking facilities, therefore please do not enter and park inside of the school gates. Please be extra cautious when driving in the area around school. Many of the children walk to/from school, some unaccompanied, which we gladly encourage and their safety on our road is paramount.

#### Headlice

Please be reminded that lice are easily spreadable. Therefore, please regularly check your children for lice, you can do this by combing through. If live lice are found, please inform the school, and the entire family must be treated before the children come to school. Wearing long hair up helps for their protection.

Please remember to keep us informed of any changes in circumstances. We will be sending home next week copies of the emergency contact details we hold for your child. Please update and return as soon as possible.

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## Free School Meals

### Is my child eligible?

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically get a free school meal if they go to school. It is called Universal Infant Free School Meals. You do **not** have to apply to get these meals, but if you do receive one of the benefits listed below, you should still apply. This is because it can help raise extra funds for you child's school (called Pupil Premium). This Government funding can help with extract tuition, teaching and after school activities.

## If your child is in Year 3 or above you may also be entitled to a free school meal, if you also receive one of the benefits below.

- Universal Credit with an annual earned income of no more than £7400 after tax
- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16190

We have been so excited to welcome more children into our wonderful new classroom and outdoor area. The children are settling fantastically into their classroom and new routines.

### This week

We have met lots of our lovely staff and explored our school and all of our outdoor areas – we were especially excited to climb the play equipment and whoosh down the slide!

Alongside singing many nursery rhymes and reading stories, we have begun our focus on the book 'The Colour Monster' this week. Within this, we have discussed feelings and what they might look and feel like. We read the story 'Ruby's Worry' and talked about what might help us if we are feeling worried.

The children were introduced to Fred the Phonics Frog who only talks in Fred talk – he says things like 'Shall we get ready for l-u-n-ch?' and 'Can you j-o-g?'. Fred will join all of our phonics sessions and games, getting the children prepared for when we begin to learn our sounds and move onto segmenting and blending!

We were introduced to our date, birthday, weather and special events display and took our first photo of what we can see when we look outside of our classroom. Over the year, we will compare these monthly photos and talk about the changes we can see.



Next week

Our learning will continue to centre around the story of 'The Colour Monster' where we will continue to talk about feelings and explore colour and colour mixing. We will play lots of speaking and listening games, sing lots of songs and nursery rhymes and share stories with repeated words or phrases to encourage us to join in with retelling them. We will begin to look at the numbers I-3, comparing amounts and looking at symbols and marks.
