What A Wonderful World

We will be starting our geographical theme by finding out what we already know and what we would like to find out about people and places around the world. We will talk about any other countries, or holiday destinations closer to home that we may have visited. We will be learning about our local area and comparing it with areas of Australia and other countries in the continent of Oceania.

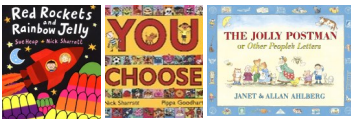


English

Phonics: We will be recapping set 1 and learning set 2 sounds using Read, Write, Inc (RWI).

Reading: We will all be putting our phonic knowledge to good use, 'sounding out' the letters in words and 'blending' them together to help us read - keep your eyes peeled in bookbags for information and new books to read at home with your children!

Writing: We will be practicing writing our names, labels, some short captions and simple sentences. We will have daily handwriting sessions to improve our letter formations and we will be creating our own 'All About Me' books to help Mr. Johnson and the children get to know each other.



Rockets and Rainbow Jelly' and 'You Choose' to help pick our favourite things. We will also be using 'The Jolly Postman' when writing a postcard from our local area, 'The Three Little Pigs' during our science topic and some non-fiction books linked to our theme. Of course, we will also be sharing a huge range of picture books and fun stories to really build up the children's love of reading.

Maths

Every day the children will practice their number fluency. This half term we are learning all about place value. Here are some of the things this will include:

- Sorting & ordering
- Counting (forwards & backwards)
- Using a number line & number track
- Writing the numerals correctly
- Finding 'one more' & 'one less' than a number
- Looking at pairs of numbers



We will move on to addition and subtraction (also within 10), solving simple problems, using lots of concrete resources to help us and using our reasoning skills to justify our explanations. To help at home, begin with singing lots of counting songs and practice writing the numbers to ten.

Science

We will be looking at a range of different, everyday materials at school and at home! We will be learning to identify different materials and talk about their properties.



Art

We will be looking at and replicating aboriginal artwork from the past and the more recent artwork of Karen McCafferty. Then we will be producing a self portrait and using the artist, Barbara Walker as our starting point.

Computing

We will be starting our Computing curriculum by finding out what 'technology' is and how to use the basic functions and how to stay safe online.

Music

Music lessons will be provided by the Norfolk Music Hub - they always sound so fun!



Physical Education

PE is held on Mondays and Fridays. We ask that children continue to arrive in their PE kits (plain tops in house colours if possible).

As much of our learning takes place outdoors (including Forest School on Fridays), we politely request that a named pair of wellies and a waterproof coat are **always** in school.
