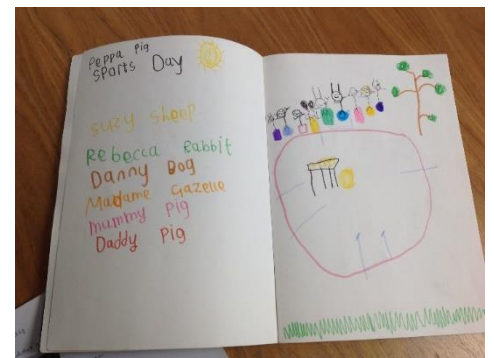
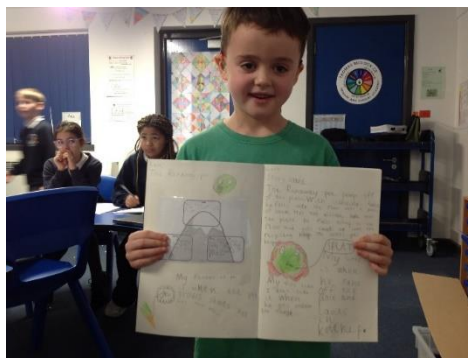
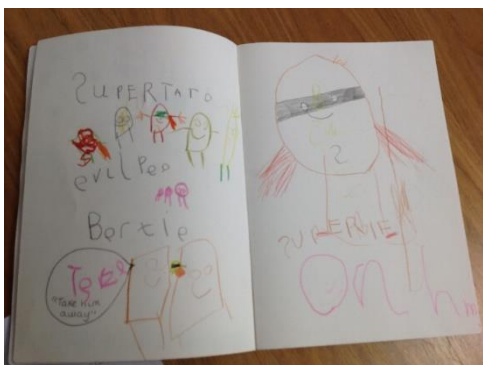


## OUR KEY LEARNING QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

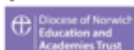


### Ethos Committee

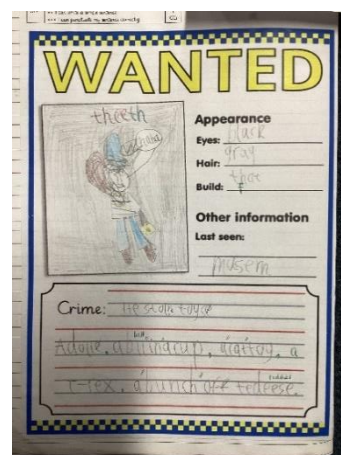
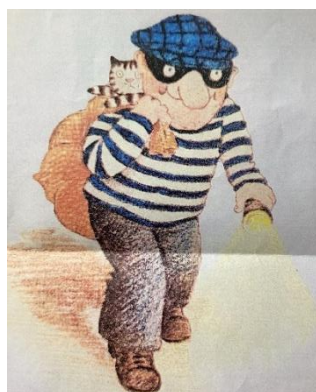
## Antarctica Class (yr R)

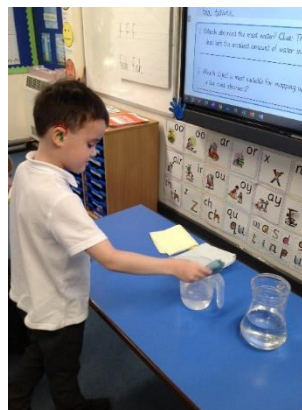
## Oceania Class (yr 1)

In English the class had a visit from Police Constable Colin DaFuzz. He brought a letter with him from the manager of Norwich Toy Museum asking for our help. Sadly, they have had a burglary at the museum and a number of toys have been stolen. The letter included a still image from the CCTV and the children were asked if they would create wanted posters of the suspect. Have you seen this man?



## Africa Class (yr 2)

In Art, children have been creating small versions of artwork by our artist Henri Matisse. Children have been experimenting using scissors and materials to create their collages. In Science, we have been learning about materials. Children have investigated the suitability of different materials. We set up an experiment to compare which material was the most absorbent.





### Europe Class (yr 3)

Year 3 had a great time at the Time & Tide Museum, we learnt how to survive the Stone Age, creating shelter, hunting animals with tools and a Time Machine was used to bring back a Stone Age hunter!



### South America Class (yr 4)

Year 4 had a great time at Norwich Castle on Monday, learning about the disagreements between the Iceni and the Romans. The children had to help an Iceni woman decide on whether she should stay loyal to the Iceni or transfer to the Roman way of life. They looked at artefacts, houses and lifestyle choices to help them make their decision.



### Asia Class (yr 5)

In science Asia class have been finding out about Sir Isaac Newton's theories relating to gravity. Here they are measuring the force of gravity acting on different classroom objects using newton meters.

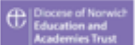

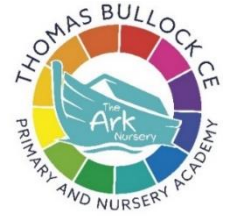

# The Ark Nursery Newsletter



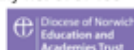
## Last week

We have been introduced to the story of 'The Leaf Thief' – the children have all gathered round each day to hear the next part of the story revealed. They were amazed about what the leaf thief actually was! In Maths, we have been introduced to the number 2. Alongside lots of finger counting, rhymes and number recognition, we have also practised our subitising for numbers 1 and 2 now. We discussed Remembrance Day throughout the week, making our own poppy wreath from our handprints for the Remembrance Service on Friday. We also had lots of discussions surrounding Anti-Bullying Week and Children in Need this week too.



## This week

We have been retelling the story of 'The Leaf Thief' many times this week – the children have absolutely loved this book! We have also been making marks on our class story map too. In Maths sessions, we have continued learning about the number 2, subitising and representing the number, on 5-frames and with real life objects. We also enjoyed exploring the snow this week and finding ice in our outdoor areas! As part of Road Safety Week, the children have learnt about different crossings, how we cross a road safely and any dangers to watch out for. We have also learnt about the importance of oral hygiene and have practised brushing our teeth to keep them squeaky clean!







### Next week

Next week's will be focussed on 'The Gruffalo'. We will be re-telling the story with actions, repeating phrases from the story and doing more mark making! In Maths, we will look at AB patterns (e.g. red cube, green cube, red cube, green cube). We will match actions to instrumental sounds and practise our listening skills. Very excitingly, we will also begin practising our singing ready for our Christmas Performance (further details will be sent out soon – like last year, our performance will be a recorded and edited video for all to see!)
