Ruby (yr 6) came 2nd in a 'Design a Deck' competition and her artwork is now officially displayed on the Deck!







We have had a very busy couple of weeks filled with Christmas activities. We've made lots of wonderful crafts and decorations that have been coming home on our last days of nursery before Christmas. We've enjoyed seeing what the elf has been up to each day and counting down the days to Christmas with our advent calendar. We have been consolidating our maths learning and making Christmas marks! In-between lots of Christmas crafts and activities, we were super excited during our Christmas lunch, making our own wreaths with natural materials and making and decorating gingerbread men too.
