Our Literacy work is going to be based on these books:







We will be discussing ideas with a speaking and listening focus; writing captions; sequencing and retelling familiar stories and describing characters (orally and written).

In Maths we will be exploring the composition and comparing numbers O and 5-10 reinforcing `one more' and `one less'; investigating capacity, mass, height, length and time; combining two groups.

In phonics we will be consolidating set I sounds and learning the set I special friends in our PCM ditties group. When ready, our red ditties group will begin set 2 sounds.

This half term's learning:

Our topic this term is 'a journey in time'

We will be focusing our learning around the topic of SPACE for this half term.
